NBA Legend Jerry West Visits JOBE

lerry West, one of L.A.'s – and the nation's – greatest sports legends spoke to lobe residents on Oct. 15. West opened his speech by talking about his childhood. "It's a dark story," he said. It was basketball that changed his life as he went on to star at West Virginia University, co-captain the gold-medal winning 1960 U.S. Olympic basketball team along with Oscar Robertson, and then enter into his amazing NBA career. He starred on the Bill Sharman-coached Laker team that won 33 games in a row and the L.A. Lakers' first NBA championship in 1972. The 33-game win streak is a record for all professional sports in the U.S. West, who now works for the Clippers, talked about his lifelong career in basketball, and so much more. He emphasized two words to the group – envy and jealously – two things that should be avoided throughout one's life. He talked about setting goals and doing what it takes to achieve those goals. He talked about avoiding drugs and always showing caution. "You have red, yellow and green lights," he said. "For me, there is either red or green. If there is caution, don't do it." West also talked about his personal struggles with depression but also pointed out he has had a great life because of basketball and because of a creative mind. "I can see things clearly," he said. He also talked about the importance of smiling, being nice, and helping the less fortunate.
